CUSTOM HAND-BLOWN GLASS SCULPTURE

I am an artist. If you ask me why, I'll tell you it's as necessary to me as breathing. It's how I understand myself and the world around me. Through art we see ourselves more clearly.

I have been blowing glass for over 20 years. I am captivated by molten glass and the process of blowing it into surprising linear and organic shapes, capturing its fluidity and grace. I have created numerous public and private commissions, working with homeowners, architects,

designers, art committees, and engineers to create the most harmonious synergy between the glass and its intended environment. In working with clients, I have many conversations to understand their needs. What are the visual goals? How does the artwork need to activate the space? Who is the end viewer and how should he or she be affected by it? Practical aspects like budget, timelines, engineering challenges, and long term maintenance and care concerns are also taken into account. Understanding all of these points is crucial in creating a beautiful and successful custom commissioned artwork.



















Form and function have never been so beautiful together. Hand-blown glass with custom colors and shapes sculpted over hand-built steel frames that house dimmable LED lighting systems.
